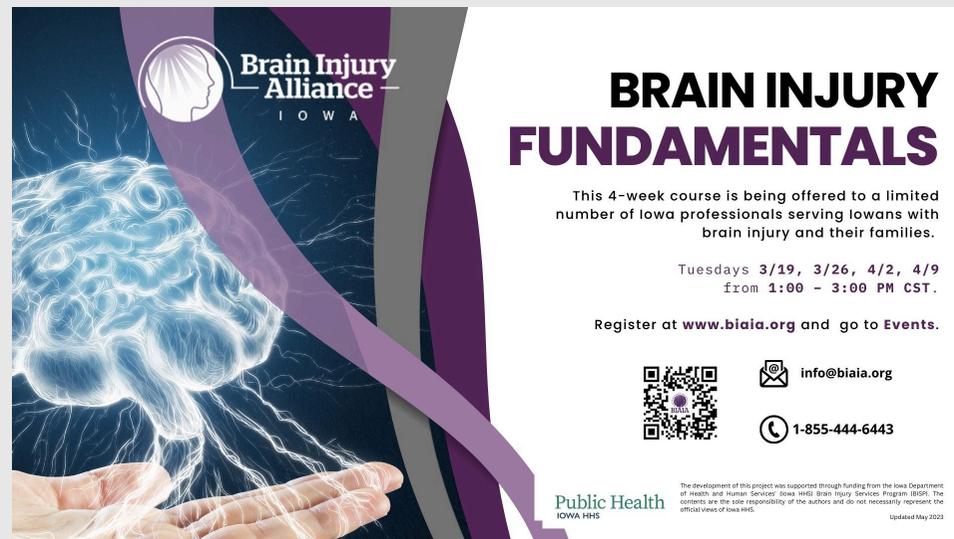

Mild Traumatic Brain Injuries and Risk for Affective and Behavioral Disorders
